CAA applauds Ontario government's focus on road safety as plans are announced for the legalization of cannabis

Thornhill, ON, August 14, 2018 – <u>CAA South Central Ontario (CAA SCO)</u> commends the Ontario government for signalling that road safety will be a top priority as cannabis becomes legal.

CAA SCO believes more work is required to ensure all drivers are aware of both the dangers and penalties associated with driving while drug-impaired.

"It is important that the government makes road safety and motorist education a top priority," said Teresa Di Felice, AVP of government and community relations for CAA SCO. "Ontario roads are some of the safest in North America and we want to keep it that way when cannabis is legalized."

<u>Research</u> conducted by Ipsos on behalf of CAA SCO indicates that two-in-five current cannabis users in Ontario have operated a vehicle while under the influence of marijuana.
